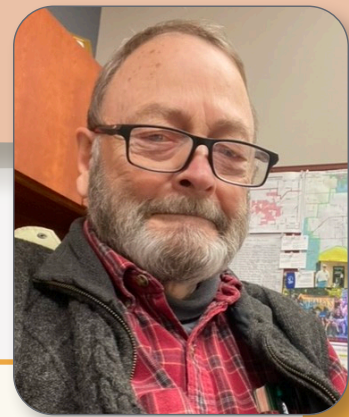

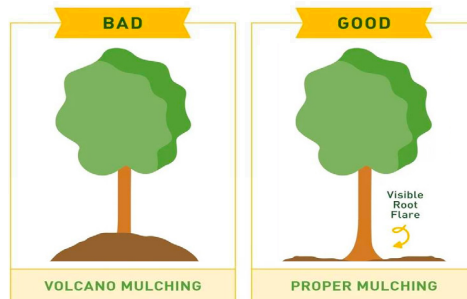

REMINDER TO RESIDENTS – You should have received a Cross Connection Control Survey in the mail with your utility bill, like “the one pictured to the right. The Illinois Environmental Agency requires every water supply provider to develop and implement a backflow prevention control program. The program mandates surveying all water customers to identify and eliminate connections that could allow contaminants to flow back into the drinking water from sources as fire protection sprinkler systems, boilers, lawn sprinklers and swimming pools. USING MULCH AROUND YOUR TREES THIS SPRING?

Mulching is important to a tree's health. Make sure you are mulching your trees the right way.

- Mulch out, not up! No deeper than the heel of your hand, generally 2-4 inches.
- Back off from the trunk! Keep all mulch away from the trunk of the tree, allowing the root flare to show just above ground level.
- Mulch to the tree's drip line, if possible! • Keep the trunk dry and the roots moist!

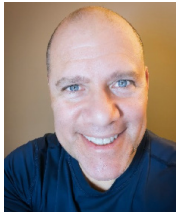

Chaplain's Corner

Why We All Need Winter

I am writing this on Feb. 3rd and the temperature is going up to a balmy 10 degrees today. Winter! Now, I ask you: is there a better reason to whine? A better reason to complain, than winter? I can give myself to complaining about the cold temperatures, icy roads, and all those endless cloudy days that make up a typical winter in this part of the world. The truth is, I need winter. And so do you.

I love the seasons because they are such a helpful way of understanding the seasons of life. In my life, winters have been seasons where I have experienced the coldness of loss or disorientation from various difficult circumstances. Winters have been seasons where personal growth - spiritually, intellectually, or in any other number of areas - seems to just stop. It can feel like a kind of death and surrender of momentum and purpose.

But each time I patiently go through those winters, I have found that the season gave way to spring. Suddenly, the dark, short days of struggle became longer days of light. Where I was seemingly standing still, there began to be growth and movement. In short, life returned. And each time, I realized that the winter I went through was necessary. Something in my pride had to be broken. Some flaw in my character needed to die. I realized that I needed that experience of winter. And so do you.

Do you feel like you are in winter in your heart? Your marriage? Your career? Your relationships? When we are, determine to stay there, to not complain, to patiently learn, and to willingly surrender the dark attitudes and practices that we all can struggle with. The season of spring - of growth and life - always comes after the season of winter in our lives. If we fight the winter, we just won't flourish and thrive as we should in the spring. A wise king once wrote, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." - Ecclesiastes 3:1. Whatever season we are in, lets encourage one another while we are in it, and welcome the change and growth we need.

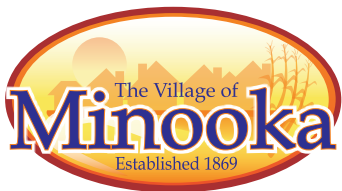

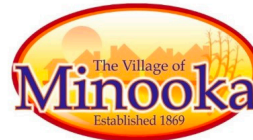

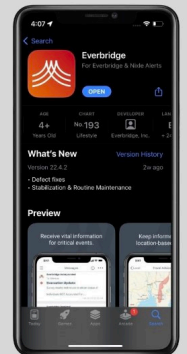
