

### **PUBLIC WORKS**

The change of seasons is upon us. Please read this useful information regarding snow removal and ice control.

### **Snow Plowing Policies:**

All streets and alleys are plowed within eight hours or less of a snowfall. The main streets are the first plowed, followed by salting intersections, and hills. Secondary streets are always plowed, followed by salting at a lesser application rate. This is all dependent on weather conditions.

### **Parking Restrictions:**

Residents are reminded that the Village has an ordinance requiring all vehicles to be parked off the street during and immediately following a snowfall of 2-inches or more. Any vehicle in violation of this ordinance shall be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense by the police department.

### Portable Basketball Standards:

Please remove any of the portable basketball standards that are left curbside or sometimes even on the street. Basketball backboards and hoops often protrude into the traffic lanes and have caused damages to snow plow trucks or other large vehicles that need to follow the curb line.

### **Depositing Snow in Roadways:**

Residents clearing their own drives should avoid blowing or pushing snow into the streets. This creates a traffic hazard to motorist who may be unable to distinguish between freshly piled snow and the roadway potentially may cause an accident.

### **Mailbox Damage Prevention:**

Please make sure your mailbox is secured to the post and in good condition. We receive a few calls during the winter about damaged mailboxes due to snow plowing operations. The force of the snow discharged off the plow creates a wave of snow that may knock mailboxes over if they have weak post or are not fastened properly to the post.

### **Child Safety:**

Discourage your children from playing in piles of snow that may exist along the roadways or parkways, especially near driveway entrances.

### **Private Drives:**

Subdivision residents living on private streets should be aware that the homeowners associations may be responsible for snow removal for all private streets and driveways.

### **Public Works Crew**

Our priority is to clear the streets in a timely manner, providing the emergency response vehicles access to each residence and each building. Next we focus on clearing the streets for the residents providing a way to get to school, work, etc. Please help out by reviewing this list of reminders to help us make this winter a safe one.











### I-80 Rebuild and Renewal Underway

The work to rebuild sixteen miles of I-80 in Will and Grundy Counties has begun and includes:

• The \$1.2 billion project includes the extension of Houbolt Road across the Des Plaines River, rehabilitation or replacement of over thirty bridges including the I-80

**Des Plaines River bridges**, as well as interchange and mainline reconstructions.

• The project will proceed in phases, with Minooka and Grundy County's section of the roadway slated for work in 2023. The rebuild is planned to be **completed by 2028**.

### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT**

### 2015 International Fire Code 505.1 - Address Identification

It is important to have a visible address on your home or business to ensure that Police/Fire/Ambulance services can quickly come to aid in an emergency. International Fire Code 505.1 requires all new and existing buildings to display address identification.

For more information, please call the Village of Minooka Building Department at 815-467-2151.

### The identification must:

- · Be legible.
- Be placed in a position visible from the street/road fronting the property.
- · Contrast with their background.
- Shall be Arabic numbers or alphabetical letters, numbers shall not be spelled out.
- Shall not be less than four (4) inches high.

### Chaplain's Corner

I am a New Yorker at heart. I grew up on Long Island in a town that was as far away from downtown Manhattan as Minooka is from the Loop. My mom is the youngest of 9, and in the 1930's and 1940's many in her family moved from Puerto Rico to New York to find work. I had aunts and uncles in the Bronx and Spanish Harlem, and we spent Christmas and New Year's Eve enjoying family in the city.

We were a large, extended family that would gather in an impossibly small apartment, sit on plastic covered furniture, and welcome the New Year watching the ball of light fall on a small black and white TV. It was our family tradition. It was our family culture. It was wonderful.

I graduated from my family with some wonderful traditions. I also left my home with some not so wonderful (translate: helpful) traditions. Now that I am slightly north of 60, I find I am still celebrating the beauty and love that I experienced in my family, while at the same time, being open to understanding and healing from some of the liabilities that I carry from my family. Most of these liabilities show up in my relationships: my tendency to be a people pleaser; my avoidance of conflict; my judgementalism... to name a few.

This new year, let's make a choice to be real with ourselves and celebrate the positive, helpful traditions that we want to pass along to our families, and that we want to live out, where appropriate, in our professional lives. Let's also be real with ourselves and understand and name our liabilities, be open to healing and finding help, and in so doing, become the best version of ourselves for our families, our workplace, and our community.

### NEWS FROM WITHIN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

### **Prohibited Parking Ordinance Reminder:**

As much as we all dread it or love it, winter is right around the corner, which means it's time to remind you of our ordinance of no parking on Village streets during snowfall.



### 9-1-24: PROHIBITED PARKING DURING SNOW REMOVAL OPERATIONS:

It shall be unlawful for any person to park any motor vehicle on any highway, street, or alley within the village when snow shall have accumulated to a depth of two inches (2") or more on such highway, street, or alley. It shall be unlawful to so park from the time of such accumulation until the snow has been removed. In addition to all other remedies, every person who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects or refuses to comply with this section shall be sentenced as provided in section 1-4-1 of this code for each offense. Each occurrence shall constitute a separate offense. Members of the police department are hereby authorized to cause any vehicle parked in violation of this section to be removed from the highway, street, or alley, at the expense of the owner of the vehicle, pursuant to applicable statutes. (Ord. 2011-29, 12-20-2011)
