# Park Update

If you are a frequent visitor of Aux Sable Springs Park, you have been seeing a lot of changes during the last several months. The additions and expansions at the park are not the only improvements. The Village of Minooka was recently awarded a \$25,000 grant. The grant funds will be used to remove invasive species throughout some areas at Aux Sable Springs Park. The project is anticipated to begin during the winter months, while the change might look a little shocking at first, it is necessary to keep the natural areas healthy.







# Village Of Minooka Awarded Funding to Remove Invasive Species

Minooka, IL. May 1st 2025 — The Village of Minooka was awarded a \$25,000 grant to remove invasive species throughout Aux Sable Springs Park.

Funding for this project was provided by the Urban and Community Forestry Programs of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and USDA Forest Service Eastern Region. This institution is an equal opportunity provider. These funds are administered by The Morton Arboretum's Chicago Region Trees Initiative (CRTI).

"Our Village has had many organizations help us in the establishment of our new park, Aux Sable Springs," said Minooka Mayor Ric Offerman. "This grant will enable our Parks Committee and full board to remove some invasive species that have crept in.

Everything we can do to improve the health and appearance of this natural setting sets a better future for our park. Thank you."

The funds received will be used to remove invasive species at Aux Sable Springs Park. This would enhance not only the visual appearance of the park but also prevent future ecological damage and keep the natural areas healthy. The project is anticipated to begin during the winter months.

Invasive species, such as buckthorn and honeysuckle, can cause widespread damage in local forests if left unmanaged. Grant funds will also be used to plant new trees to grow tree canopy in the community.

"Improving the distribution of trees and green spaces directly impacts the health and economic outcomes for communities," said CRTI Director Zach Wirtz. "Projects like this improve quality of life and boost the urban tree canopy's resilience to threats posed by environmental conditions, pests and diseases."

When you hear that, you know what's coming next, right? The dreaded, digital "thump", or "beep-beep" that means what you were really doing is holding "while we try to DISCONNECT you!" Think of all the connections we want to make in life: we want to have a healthier connection with our teenager, our neighbor, our parents, our brother or sister, and the list goes on. 

### ORDINANCE REMINDERS

#### 7-1-4: BURNING OF WASTE MATERIALS:

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to burn waste materials within the village limits, except as regulated herein. Any person violating this section shall be punishable as provided in section 1-4-1 of this code.

- B. All burning of waste materials is subject to the following regulations:

  1. Burning Prohibited: Except as hereinafter provided it shall be unlawful to burn any material, including, but not limited to, "landscape waste" and "municipal waste" as hereinafter defined.
  - Definitions:

 $LANDSCAPE\ WASTE.\ All\ accumulations\ of\ grass\ or\ shrubbery,\ leaves\ and\ all\ accumulations\ of\ grass\ or\ shrubbery,\ leaves\ and\ all\ accumulation\ of\ grass\ or\ shrubbery,\ leaves\ or\ shrubbery,\$ other materials accumulated in the care of lawns, shrubbery and vines

MUNICIPAL WASTE: Garbage, general household and commercial waste, industrial lunchroom or office waste, landscape waste and construction or demolition debris.

- 3. Exceptions: The following open burning activities are permitted within the
- The setting of fires by the forest preserve district of any county on property owned or controlled by it, to perform prescribed burning for natural community and habitat management;
- b. The setting of fires to combat or limit existing fires, when reasonable and necessary in the judgment of the responsible government official;

- c. The burning of fuels for legitimate campfire, recreational, and cooking purposes, or in domestic fireplaces, in areas which such burning is consistent with other laws, provided that no garbage shall be burned in such cases;
- d. Small open flames for heating tar or for welding, acetylene torches, highway safety flares, and the like.
- C. Fires shall be located not less than fifty feet (50') from any structure, with adequate provisions made to prevent the spread of fire, or the fire shall be contained in a fireproof container located not less than fifteen feet (15') from any structure.
- D. All fires shall be constantly attended until such fire is extinguished. The person attending the fire shall be equipped with a hose connected to a water supply, or
- other fire extinguishing equipment, suitable to extinguish the fire.

  E. Prior to starting the fire, the appropriate fire protection district shall be notified of the location of the fire, the nature of the materials to be burned, the date and time of the fire, and the name of the person to be attending the fire.
- F. No waste materials may be burned on any village or public street or alley.
- G. It shall be unlawful to burn styrofoam, polystyrene, any other kind of plastic material, shingles, or insulation. It shall be unlawful to burn any materials in which the above materials may be incorporated.
- H. The owner of the property where the fire is to be located, the person owning the materials to be burned, the person responsible for causing the materials to be burned, and the person attending the fire are each jointly responsible to see that the regulations set forth in this section are not violated. (Ord. 2003-02, 1-28-2003)

It shall be unlawful for anyone to permit any weeds, grass or plants, other than trees, bushes, flowers or other ornamental plants to grow to a height exceeding one foot (1') anywhere in the village, and such plants or weeds exceeding such heights are hereby declared to be a nuisance. (1977 Code; amd. 1997 Code)


