## BUILDING DEPARTMENT GUIDELINES FOR FENCE INSTALLATION

## TO OBTAIN A PERMIT, YOU WILL NEED:

-Completed Building Permit application
-A Plat of Survey showing the proposed fence location and distance from side and rear property lines
-Copy of plans from fence contractor that includes height of fence and cost
-A letter from you homeowners association approving the proposed work

## REQUIREMENTS FOR RESIDENTIAL:

-No fence may exceed four feet (4') in height in front yards
-No fence may exceed six feet (6') in height in side or rear yards
-A fence six feet ( $6^{\prime}$ ) in height shall not extend beyond the building setback line into the front yard -When any fence is installed in the front, side, or rear yard, it shall not extend beyond the property line or encroach upon adjoining property -No structure of any kind will be allowed in an overland relief route

## RESIDENTIAL CORNER LOTS:

-On all corner lots, any fence other than a decorative fence shall not extend beyond the building setback lines
-A decorative fence used mostly for aesthetics, which adds visual beauty to the property, may not exceed forty-two inches (42") in height when the fence is installed in a front or corner side yard. -Forty percent (40\%) of the square footage of the overall dimensions of the fence shall be open -A woven wire or cyclone type fence is not considered a decorative fence
