#### Summer of Ribbon Cuttings

It's a bad month to be a ribbon in the Village of Minooka. With back-to-back ribbon cuttings taking place first for the Model Homes at the Preserve at Heritage Woods and then for the Phase 2 development of Aux Sable Springs Park. The preserve is Minooka's newest residential development and will consist of 46 beautiful units of age restricted duplexes. Congratulations to the entire Preserve team who have built this much needed offering in the community!



From ground breaking to ribbon cutting



The opening of additional amenities at Minooka's flagship green space is also cause for celebration. New amenities include pickleball courts, splashpad, pavilions, a fourth baseball field, bean-bag boards, a "bamboo jungle", and accessible playground equipment. For these park improvements the Village President, Trustees, staff, and community at large extend gratitude to the late Lorraine and Jerry Davidson. The Davidsons contributed \$700,000 to Minooka's parks, \$400,000 of which was used on this project. Through the clever leveraging of these funds the Public Works Department was able to obtain a matching grant of \$400,000 from the State of Illinois, essentially doubling the impact. Representing the Davidsons at the Ribbon Cutting was Jerry and Lorraine's daughter Kathleen Kaplan, pictured on the cover holding the scissors. Thank you Kathleen for your support of the community.



#### **PUBLIC WORKS**

#### USING MULCH AROUND YOUR TREES THIS YEAR?

Mulching is important to a tree's health. Make sure you are mulching your trees the right way.

- Mulch out, not up! No deeper than the heel of your hand, generally 2-4 inches.
- Back off from the trunk! Keep all mulch away from the trunk of the tree, allowing the root flare to show just above ground level.
- Mulch to the tree's drip line, if possible! Keep the trunk dry and the roots moist!



#### STORM WATER MANAGEMENT

The Village of Minooka has a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System and follows the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System NPDES guidelines.

Did you realize that the Village has over 2,500 storm water catch basin and inlets within the Village limits that collect water from streets, parking lots, ditches, yards, roofs, etc. The storm sewer pipes convey all the water from the inlets and catch basins and then discharge it to detention ponds, creeks, streams, and rivers. Illicit dumping or discharges to areas adjacent to each catch basin or inlet create problems beyond one's belief.

#### **Public Works Control Measures**

- · Public Education and Outreach
- · Public Participation and Involvement
- · Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
- · Enforcing Construction Site Runoff Control
- · Enforcing Post-Construction Runoff Control
- · Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations

#### **Resident Control Measures**

Just walk through your neighborhood and take a look around and see what is taking place that may have a positive or negative impact to the storm water watershed.

#### Here are some of the negatives you may have observed:

- · Homeowners discharging grass or raking leaves or other organic materials into the street that will end up in the curb catch basins and storm sewers and, ultimately, into detention basins and receiving streams. This creates large amounts of decomposed materials that have to be removed from catch basins and results in sedimentation buildup within the detention basin and sewer pipes becoming plugged. This costs all of us more money to maintain.
- · Concrete truck washing out in the gutter after supplying concrete for a building project.
- · Homeowners dumping waste motor oil, antifreeze or paint products into a catch basin.
- · Parking vehicles on the street dripping fuel, motor oil, anti-freeze, or other fluids.

#### Some positive storm water practices taking place are:

- · Keeping grass clippings in your yard and not on the street by mulching or bagging the clippings.
- · Collecting used motor oil or paints and bringing them to a recycling center or disposing of them in a proper manner.
- · Collecting rain water from your home's downspouts in a rain barrel and using it to water your plants.
- · Following labels on fertilizer and herbicide products and not using them in areas that may run directly into bodies of water.
- · Not watering your lawn excessively creating runoff into streets.
- · Planting vegetation in a manner slowing water runoff during heavy rainfall.
- Adopting roadside ditches and picking up refuse that has been thrown from vehicles or has blown in from who knows where. This is a good community service project for many organizations.
- · Picking up animal waste from your pet and disposing of it properly.

#### ORDINANCE REMINDERS - COURTESY OF THE MINOOKA POLICE DEPARTMENT

#### **7-3-2: HEIGHT LIMIT:**

It shall be unlawful for anyone to permit any weeds, grass or plants, other than trees, bushes, flowers or other ornamental plants to grow to a height exceeding one foot (1') anywhere in the village, and such plants or weeds exceeding such heights are hereby declared to be a nuisance. (1977 Code; amd. 1997 Code)

July 4th is the day we celebrate the adoption of the Declaration of Independence! It is also a popular day people celebrate with fireworks. According to, Title 8 Chapter 2 Section 7 of the Village of Minooka's ordinance, fireworks are considered a nuisance and violations are subjectable to a fine.

#### 8-2-7: FIREWORKS:

A. Nuisance: It shall be unlawful and a nuisance for any person, firm, copartnership or corporation to knowingly possess, offer for sale, sell at retail, or use or explode any fireworks;

The Definition of "FIREWORKS" is: Any explosive composition or any substance or combination of substances, or article prepared for the purpose of producing a visible OR audible effect of a temporary exhibitional nature.

#### Chaplain's Corner

There is one particular memory from my one and only ride in an ambulance, that I recall with gratitude. Before I share that one particular memory, a brief backstory is in order.

The year: 2017. The month: October. The day: the 6th (my birthday.) I had a cold, which turned into a cough, which turned into... any guesses?... that is correct: bronchitis. I waited a few days before I went to immediate care. Why, you ask? I'm a guy. That's why. So with some meds by my side, I pushed through a busy October with my symptoms worsening by the day.

Fast forward to around October 25 or so. After a few weeks of telling myself that I will get better the next day (please refer to previous admission: I'm a guy), I found myself unable to breathe. This, I tell myself, is not good. So, back to immediate care for more medicine.

Long story short: I could barely walk across a parking lot without feeling like I was unable to take in or expel any air. After getting my meds, I headed home, somehow stumbled up the front steps, collapsed on the couch and had enough air in my lungs to say to my wife, "Call 911." There are lots of memories I could share after I asked my wife to call 911. Here is the particular one I do want to share. It can still bring me to tears, because it was a reminder of how profoundly impactful one little act of care can be.

After getting stabilized in the emergency room my two colleagues and friends came and sat by my bed: Arol, the lead pastor of Mission Bible Church, and Jason, then the student pastor. They just sat there. Since I was taking a stroll somewhere in "la-la" land for most of the time, they just talked and laughed together by my side. And, to this day, I remember it as one of the most beautiful things that these two friends have ever done for me. Their presence made me feel loved and cared for.

Being present to someone is a gift of love that can leave a deep, positive impact in their soul. Are you present to your children? Do you listen? I mean just listen, and then thank them for sharing. Are you present to those who are hurting around you? Are you present to your spouse and their needs? Are you present to yourself? The Apostle Paul wrote, "rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep" (Romans 12:15). In other words, be present. Words are not necessary, but your presence is. On May 27th one of our "good boys" worked his last shift. K9 Rueger is hanging up his vest and the only work he will be doing is playing fetch in the backyard. Rueger has been a part of Minooka Police Department since 2014 and his work has directly



led to the seizure of substantial quantities of illegal narcotics and U.S. currency including: 68,000 grams of cannabis, 16,000 grams of cocaine, 6,000 grams of methamphetamine, 4,000 grams of heroin, 1,440 MDMA pills and over \$283,000 in illicit currency.

#### Back to School - Safety Tips:

The start of a new school year is an exciting and busy time for families. It is up to all of us to be safe and watch out for kids. Here are some safety tips we can all follow.

#### If you are driving, remember these rules:

- Use caution near schools; there will be increased traffic and pedestrians \*WATCH FOR KIDS\*

- Please OBEY crossing guards

#### **Kids**

- Cross at corners or cross walks
- Obey crossing guard instructions

- Walk the approved route to school with your child before school starts; this way you know where to look for your child if there is a problem

- Discuss what your child should do if an unknown adult tries to get them to come to their car, in their house, or grabs them
- Know who your kids' friends are and where they live, and keep a list of addresses and phone numbers handy




